
Mission

Hidaya serves as a platform to change the educational and socio-economic condition of muslims through education, awareness, motivation and facilitation, with greater involvement of people in the development activities and the empowerment, which are environment friendly, accessible, sustainable and easily applicable.

The Trust aims at establishing educational institutions, professional, vocational, scientific, technological, health centers and Residential accommodations in order to bring out an overall development of the people especially the downtrodden and backward ones.

Objectives

Aims and objectives of this Trust are......

- To initiate, set up and run educational institutions and research institutes.
- To establish, run and maintain Nursing, Midwifery and Para-medical training institutes mainly for the upliftment of backwards and minorities.
- To establish and manage charitable health centers for weaker sections of the community.
- To promote advancement of education and to establish training centers.
- To establish and run Garments, Fashion and Tailoring Training Schools and shops, for the people of weaker section engaged in readymade garments industries.
- To work for the all-round development of the society including literacy campaign, health care, awareness on pollution, hygienic sanitation, immunization and baby care.
- To provide financial assistance to schools, madrasas and to award scholarships and other kinds of aid to poor and orphan students including supply of books, educational kits and other incentives.
- To award scholarship to deserving students for technical, medical, professional or general studies and to provide financial assistance to deserving students for higher studies.
- To establish and run research center, library and study center, audio and video based mobile exhibition cum visual library
- To organize education seminars and symposiums to encourage value based social life, development of education and different aspects of the social science in the light of the revealed Book of the Sustainer.
- To establish institutions for the physically differently abled persons and to provide them education, training and other help.
- To take special care of female literacy especially in rural areas.
- To promote and encourage the social development work.
- To assist social activists, philanthropists and noble personalities and to encourage philanthropic activities and programs relating to basic moral values.
- To develop, construct, repair and manage religious places, wakf properties, orphanage, musafirkhana, rehabilitation and adult education centers and burial grounds.
- To organize relief camps, relief work in the event of natural calamities, riots, flood, drought and social upheavals in any part of the country.

- To organize campaign against ill-habits, pollution, malnutrition, alcoholism, smoking, nudity, drug addiction, polio and AIDS.
- To create and accept donations, subscriptions, charges, fees, gifts, benefactions, bequests and grants in cash or kind from public, institutions, government from inside the country and abroad for achieving the objectives of the Trust.
- To take initiative for the development of minority and backward classes of people particularly for the families belonging to the "below poverty line".

Summary of Sachar Committee Report

The Rajinder Sachar Committee, appointed in 2005 by the Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, was commissioned to prepare a report on the latest social, economic and educational condition of the Muslim community of India. The committee was headed by the former Chief Justice of Delhi High Court Rajinder Sachar, including other six members. The committee prepared a report of 403 pages, and presented in the lower house (Lok Sabha) of the Indian Parliament on 30 November 2006 (20 months after obtaining the terms of reference from the PMO).

The committee had highlighted and presented its suggestions and solutions to include mainstream Indian Muslims. The report is first of its kind revealing the backwardness of Indian Muslims.

According to Sachar Committee report some of the Key Findings are:

- The status of Indian Muslims are below the conditions of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.
- The overall percentage of Muslims in bureaucracy in India is just 2.5% whereas Muslims constitute above 14% of Indian population.
- There was a wide-spread demand for affirmative action especially in the form of reservations.
- Muslim children are at a slightly higher risk of child malnutrition than other Hindu children.
- As many as 25 percent of Muslim children in the 6-14 year age group have either never attended school or have dropped out.
- Only one out of the 25 under- Graduate student and one out of the 50 post Graduate student is a Muslim in premier colleges.
- The presence of Muslims was found to be only 3% in IAS, 1.8% in IFS and 4% in IPS.
- Share of Muslims in employment in various departments is abysmally low at all levels.
- In no state does the representation of Muslims in the Government departments match their population share.
- In the light of the observations in the report the 'Sachar Committee' made so many recommendations; one such is reproduced here for general awareness;
- Mechanism to ensure equity and equality of opportunity to bring about inclusion should be such that diversity is achieved and at the same time the perception of discrimination is eliminated.

A brief history of emergence of the "Hidaya Foundation Trust".......

After looking at the Sachar Committee report it was realized that the present condition of the Indian Muslims was very miserable. Therefore, for the improvement of the society a galaxy of lovers of education including health awareness, prudent, dedicated, honest, souls and philanthropists put their heads and hearts together and affirmed to form a charitable, non-profitable educational and Socio-Welfare Organization in order to take the entire burden of the so called backward communities for their overall developments. The untiring efforts of those souls brought the emergence of the desired Trust called as "THE HIDAYA FOUNDATION TRUST" in the year 2008.

So far work taken up by "Hidaya Foundation Trust".....

Presently the prime focus of the trust are Education, Health, and Socio-Economy. With an aim to establish the educational institutions right from school level to higher education in all streams, the trust has devoted itself to the following academic activities.

Education and Awareness:

Free coaching to students: 61 students of class X level were provided free coaching at the premises of no. 2 Moukhali primary school of Howrah district.

Spoken English teaching: 21 students are being taught 'Spoken English' at Sultanpur, Howrah.

Computer training: 26 aspirants are being trained in Computer courses at Sultanpur, Howrah.

Training to Haj pilgrims: Every year Haj pilgrims (ladies and gents) are given training on different aspects of Haj performance through video projection at different places of Howrah in collaboration with the **West Bengal State Haj Committee**, Government of West Bengal.

Scholarships to poor and needy students:

- The Trust bears the entire educational expenses of 5 needy but poor residential students studying at Hope Institute of Bengal at Beldubi, Panchla, Howrah.
- One Medical student was provided his Admission-Fees for admission to Medical course in 2009-2010 besides that more than 40 students were provided educational Scholarships.

Women education: For last-4 years more than 80 ladies were given Shariah education (Teachings in Islamic knowledge)

Centres for Quranic education: 21 days short course in Quranic learning is provided to the people by the experts at the centres at Argori, Baksara, No.2 Moukhali, Panchpara, Sultanpur and Bankra, Howrah District.

Distribution of awards: In a social gathering at Nibra, Howrah, successful meritorious students in public examinations were awarded. Besides that awareness programs are held regularly. Educational tours are also arranged annually.

Other academic activities are also taken up as and when required in liaison with nearby educational institutes.

Activities in the health affairs:

The Trust is devotionally engaged in bringing health awareness cum consciousness amongst the people in and around the locality.

Blood donation camps: Blood donation camps are held at regular intervals. It was held at Bankra Munshidanga, no.2 Moukhali and other localities.

Eye camp: In collaboration with 'Howrah Lions Club' eye camp was held at Sultanpur, Howrah.

Health camps: Health camps are held almost regularly, at different places of Howrah.

Centers for medical facilities: An expert team of Medical Practitioners advise the Patients.

- Arrangements are made for admission of patients to suitable Hospitals/Nursing homes etc. as and when required.
- Needy patients are sent for better medical treatment in the Hospitals of Dr. Debi Sethi, Christian Medical College, Sain Baba Hospital situated in South India.
- Poor-needy patients are provided financial assistances whenever it is needed.

Health awareness programs: Such programs are always held especially in the field of Family Welfare and planning.

Hidaya health care unit: This unit has been established by the Trust at its own spaces at Ankurhati, chekpost, Howrah.

Patients are treated at the minimum cost by the renowned medical practitioners in all medical areas. Medicines at concessional rates are provided to the patients.

Social activities:

In addition to rendering services to the needy, poor and backward community people the Trust also dedicates itself to the following activities:

Flood relief.

- Flood victims were provided a financial assistance of Rs. 1 lakh each at Amta no.2 block Tajpur by Tokapur no.2 block Udaynarayanpur of Howrah District, Ghantal of east Midnapur District.
- 3 lakh were distributed to the victims of Kelghai under pataspur block of East Midnapur District.
- Rs. 5000 was paid to the flood victims of Tokapur under Udaynarayanpur Block of Howrah Dist.
- Rs. 6 lakh was distributed amongst aila-Affected people of south 24 pargana.

Distribution of blankets: Nearly 500 pieces of blankets were distributed amongst the people of Nibra, Munsidanga and no.2 Moukhali area of Howrah district.

Installation of tube-well: Deep tubewell costing Rs.80000 (approx.) for drinking water was installed at Baganda Girls Madrasa under Uluberia of Howrah district.

Public meeting against global terrorism: Such public gatherings were held at Domjur, Unsani and Sultanpur of Howrah district.

Majlis-e-iftaar: It's a regular annual affair. Community Iftars are arranged at every Ramzan at Bankra, Howrah district. Dignitaries like Syed Masih, the ex -Chief Whip of Legislative Assembly, Govt. of West Bengal, Sri Swadesh Chakraborty, the then M.P and others joined the Iftar.

Khaadim-ul-hujjaj (haj welfare volunteering): Every year prior to the beginning of the Haj-Pilgrimage the Trust forms a group of volunteers, both boys and girls, in order to help, guide and take proper care of the Haj pilgrims at the district(s) and at the Calcutta Airport during their journey for Haj to and fro in collaboration with the W.B.STATE HAJ COMMITTEE, Government of West Bengal.

Field of education:

- A full-fledged English and also vernacular medium schools from Nursery to Higher Secondary level in Arts, Science and Commerce streams including emerging professional subjects is to be established within a year or two.
- D.Ed., B.Ed., M.Ed., B.P.Ed., M.P.Ed and other Courses are to be opened phase wise at the proposed institute(s) to be established shortly.
- Nurses training centers- Diploma / Degree courses are to be set up shortly.
- Management and Technology institutions are to be established shortly.
- Institute(s) for nonprofessional courses (undergraduate and Postgraduate) with Hostel facilities to be established.
- Institution[s] for Spiritual or Religious learning to be established

Field of health:

At present the Trust has been running a health care unit since last 4 years at Ankurhati, Howrah, where doctors, expert in different necessary fields render their services round the year. Downtrodden people are receiving benefits to their satisfaction.

- Establish Nurses Training Centers- Diploma, Degree or PG Courses at its own plots of land which will be acquired soon.
- Set up charitable as well as commercial Hospitals to cater modern facilities to the people, especially the Community people.

Residential accommodation:

• The Trust has drawn the plan of acquiring different plots of land where residential accommodations shall be provided to the people at subsidized rates as far as practicable. It is also decided to establish a housing estate with all modern facilities in it including educational institutions, Hospitals and worship place(s) as far as possible by the grace of "Almighty".

Upcoming Projects

- To open Vocational Streams-in zari works, Advanced-modern Tailoring-works, Advancebamboo crafts works and other artisan Works suitable to the present needs in collaboration with Aliah University, Govt. of West Bengal and other like Minded NGOs.
- To Start Elementary and Primary level classes including Nursery, K.G classes.
- To establish D.Ed. and B.Ed. Courses.
- To open a Nurses Training Center[s] and Diploma Course at present.

- To open diagnostic-pathology laboratories etc. at concessional rate to help poor patients.
- To open Department of theology (deeniyat), Memorizing (Hifz), Arabic (Alimiyaat) for boys and girls separately possibly in liaison with Jamia Islamia Isha'at ul Uloom, Akkalkuwa, Maharastra and likewise NGOs.
- To set up coaching Centre(s) for Joint Entrance Examinations (JEE), UPSC, WBPSC of allied competitive Examinations- state or central level. If infrastructural facilities are available residential coaching/training Centers will be set up by the grace of Almighty.

Hidaya stood firmly beside the riot-victims of Assam......

The Trust dedicated itself to help the riot victims of Assam. It runs from one corner of the state to the other for rendering its services to the people in dire need. Under the leadership of Prof. MD. MUFTI OSMAN Sb. of Delhi DEOBAND Institute with the help of TABLIGH-E-JAMAT of Bilasiapara, Assam. The Trust stayed continuously for 5 days (5th to 10th May, 2012) in the Refugee Relief camps in the area of Kokrajhar, Assam. The Trustees personally distributed the relief item badly needed to the victims. The trustees had to be detained for 2 days in the curfew bound in district Dhubri of Assam.

The following items were given physically to 13000 victims spread throughout 24 camp. (camps were at village Sarpat, Basmari, Mamudpur, Baity, Herbheri, Beltari, Gorosthan and Barupara etc.)

- Lungi-1000 pcs
- Sari-1000 pcs
- Mosquito nets-1600 pcs
- Utensils-2500 pcs
- Children's Wear-6000 pcs
- Shirts-750 pcs
- Rs. 500 in cash to each victim
- Milk powder-5 big packets
- Sufficient Quantity of Medicines

Janab Shamim Molla, an honorary member of **Indian Red Cross Society** and a resident of Bilasipara of Dhubri, Assam, left no stone unturned in the relief work of Hidaya Foundation Trust. Trust remains grateful to Janab Shamim for his dedicated works.

A large number of Mosques and Madrasahs of Kokrajhar under Dolma PS met a widespread destruction. The Secretary of Hidaya foundation Trust assured the Imams of those destructed Mosques for providing sufficient Relief as soon as the socio-political situation normalizes. 8 Moulanas have been deputed on a fixed salary to those 24 Relief Camps so that they keep on counselling the riot-victims to maintain their peace of mind having full faith in Almighty who shall overcome the temporary crisis of theirs. We all should pray for their peace here and hereafter.

Haji Janab Intezar Ahmed, the Secretary, Cooch Bihar Nutan Masjid Committee and President, Cooch Bihar Gorosthan Committee and a renowned socio-educational worker of Cooch Bihar town led the team of Hidaya Foundation Trust to Assam for its relief works. The D.M. of Howrah issued an introductory certificate to the Trust. This certificate helped the Team of Trust to distribute the relief items to the Riot-victims without any hindrances. Janab Intezar sahab stayed with us and due to his acquaintances in Assam the work of relief distribution and other organizational works went on very smoothly by the grace of Almighty.


